



## 2012 Alumni Survey Report

The School of Public and Community Health Sciences conducted an online alumni survey in the spring of 2012. The survey provided a snapshot of where MPH graduates are now, and gave graduates the opportunity to provide feedback about the effectiveness of the program in preparing them for a career in public health. Results will be used to improve the MPH program by identifying strengths and areas in need of development related to the program's 10 core competencies.

Of the 19 MPH graduates, 12 participated for an overall response rate of 63%.

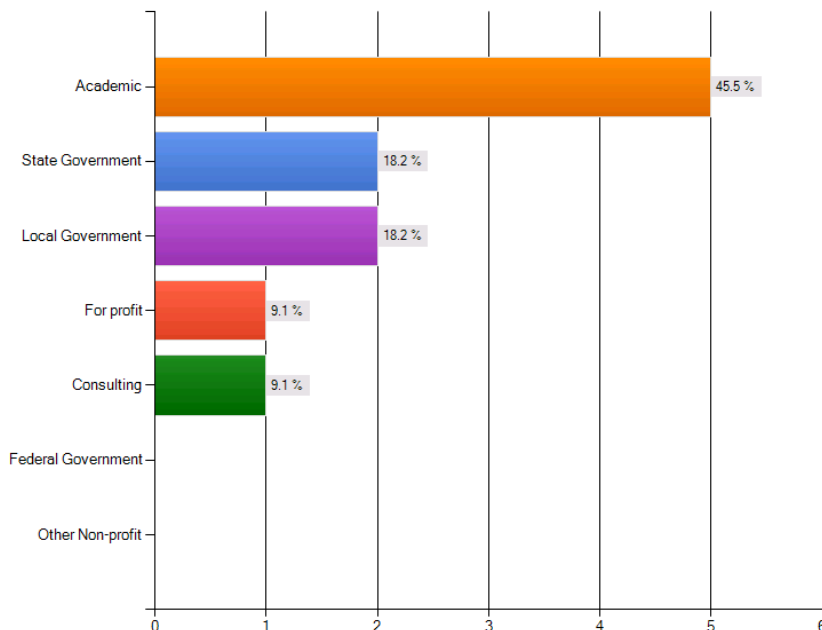
### Demographics
